

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About SCAG

SCAG Region

- Nation's largest Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO)
- Consist of 6 Counties and 191 Cities
- 16th Largest Economy in the World
- Population: 18 million (5.8% of US population; 48.5% of CA population)
- Household: 5.8 million
- Wage Jobs: 7.8 million
- Parcels: 4.8 million



Small Area Forecasting

- Small Area: Below City (Census Tracts / BG / Block, TAZ, Parcel, MPU)
- Developing Reasonable, Consistent, Acceptable, and Collaborative Small Area Data Set
- Two Key relationships
 - Geographical relationship (Aggregation and Disaggregation)
 - Temporal relationship (Monotonous vs. Fluctuation)

Importance of Census Data

- Key Data Source (Best Reference)
- The number of seats in Congress
- The allocation of federal fund.
- Public and Private sectors use census data to make important decisions
- Census Block data is the base of small area data development

Census 2010 Block Data

- Redistricting Data Summary File (Public Law 94-171/PL94)
 - Released March, 2011
(254,085 blocks in the SCAG region)
 - 5 Major Variables:
 - Population by Race
 - Population by Hispanic Origin
 - Population over 18 by Race
 - Population over 18 by Hispanic Origin
 - Occupancy Status

Census 2010 Block Data - cont.

- Table P-42 (group quarters information) from the 2010 Census Summary File 1 (GQ data)
 - Released April, 2011
(8,495 blocks in SCAG region)
 - 10 variables: Group Quarters Population by Group Quarters Type

Census 2010 Block Data - cont.

- **2010 Census Summary File 1**
 - Released June, 2011
 - 331 variables: Race, Hispanic Origin, Age, Sex, Household Type, Household Size, Family Type, Family Size, Group Quarters, Occupancy Status, Householder, ETC

RTP08 vs. RTP12

- 2008 Regional Transportation Plan
 - Based on DOF data
- 2012 Regional Transportation Plan
 - Based on Census data (2011)



Compare SED at TAZ (DOF vs. PL94)

- SCAG TAZ: consists of 4,109 Tier1 zones and 11,267 Tier2 zones
- Symmetric Mean Absolute Percentage Error (sMAPE)

$$\text{sMAPE} = \frac{1}{n} \sum_{t=1}^n \frac{|A_t - F_t|}{A_t + F_t}$$

sMAPE	0.1125	0.0873


Difference in Households at TAZ




Difference in Populations at TAZ

Method for Finding Problematic Blocks

- Select blocks with boundaries that intersect freeways, ramps, or major roads.
- From the previous step, select blocks that have housing units or group quarter population.
- Then identify blocks with areas less than **4,000 square meters**. Then identify blocks where the ratio of area and housing units (**area/housing units**) is less than **600**.
- We observed about 800 blocks with possible errors and *manually verified* the presence of problematic data by checking aerial imagery.

Types of Census 2010 Data Error

- Housing units in blocks that are entirely located within freeways, ramps, or major roads.
- Housing units in blocks that are entirely located within water bodies.
- Group quarters population in blocks that are entirely located within freeways, ramps, or major roads.
- Group quarter institutions that has been located in a wrong census block.




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

CQR Program

- 2010 Census Count Question Resolution
- A mechanism for **State, local and Tribal officials of governmental units** in the U.S. and Puerto Rico to challenge the 2010 Census **population counts of housing units and group quarters**.
- The Count Question Resolution (CQR) Program will address questions about housing unit and group quarters counts for three types of challenges for the 2010 Decennial Census: **(1) boundary, (2) geocoding, and (3) coverage**.

CQR Program – cont.

- The CQR Program will accept CQR challenges beginning June 1, 2011 and ending with challenges that are received and postmarked, faxed, or emailed as of June 1, 2013.
- All functioning governmental units such as States, Counties, and Cities can challenge the 2010 Census counts.
