California FAIR Plan Stabilization Act**

Dear Governor Newsom:


On behalf of the Southern California Association of Governments, I am pleased to support Assembly Bill (AB) 226, authored by Assemblymembers Lisa Calderon and David Alvarez, which aims to enhance the California Fair Access to Insurance Requirements Plan's (FAIR Plan's) financial liquidity and capacity to handle claims by authorizing the California Infrastructure and Economic Development Bank (IBank) to issue bonds to finance the cost of claims.

Since its establishment in 1968, the FAIR Plan has served as a crucial state safety-net program to provide basic property insurance to California residents who would otherwise have no access. Although created to function as a last resort, more Californians have turned to the Plan for basic property coverage as insurers have increasingly declined to provide new coverage or renew existing policies, putting a strain on its ability to remain solvent.

AB 226 is a positive first step to addressing the ongoing insurance crisis in the state by providing the FAIR Plan with additional tools needed to improve its claim-paying capacity, making it more resilient to the major catastrophic events that have occurred in Southern California, including the most recent wildfires that affected our greater Los Angeles area.
