




Event Summary

The project team led a walk audit event along Beach Boulevard (SR-39), between Pacific Street and Cerritos Avenue, to document issues relating to pedestrian safety, accessibility, and traffic operations.

Key Findings

- Loud vehicular noises due to high vehicle speeds.
- Overgrown vegetation and trash on sidewalks.
- Frequent vehicle collisions at the northeast corner plaza of Pacific Street and Beach Boulevard due to uneven railroad track placement and speeding vehicles.
- Vacant businesses and industrial complexes.
- No traffic signal, excessive speeding, and lack of crosswalks at Main Street and Beach Boulevard.
- Cyclist and scooter users utilize parallel streets, Flower Avenue and Chestnut Avenue, instead of Beach Boulevard.


