- September 9: Final Report due



SCAG's Go Human Mini-Grants Program provides funding to non-profits and community-based organizations to implement local traffic safety projects.

Program Goal

The Go Human Mini-Grants program aims to build street-level community resiliency and increase the safety of people most harmed by traffic injuries and fatalities, including without limitation Black, Indigenous and People of Color; people with disabilities; and frontline workers, particularly those walking and biking.

Funding for this program is provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) \boxdot , through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

Eligible Applicants

Community-based organizations, non-profits, and social enterprises are eligible for a Mini-Grant.

Funding is available to recipients across the SCAG region, which encompasses the counties of Imperial, Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, San Bernardino, and Ventura.

Funding will be distributed to prioritize equity, particularly within communities that have been historically disinvested or in disadvantaged communities.

2022 Funding Cycle

The 2022 Go Human Mini-Grants Program will award up to \$15,000 each to selected traffic safety projects that emphasize community-driven co-creation and community engagement. Applications are open from Monday, March 28, 2022 to Friday, April 29, 2022.

Projects will adhere to the following schedule:

- Notice of Awards: Week of May 16, 2022
- Scope Refinement: Monday, May 16 to Friday, June 10
- · Project Implementation: Monday, June 13 to Wednesday, August 31 (12 weeks)
- · Final Report from Applicants: Friday, September 9


- The budget spreadsheet is set up to help you plan the amount of time you need to complete a project.
- Read the READ ME tab for Instructions.
 - List the job titles of all staff that will work on your Mini-Grant project. <u>List job titles and not</u> <u>names.</u>
 - List the hourly rate for each staff under. You must support the hourly rate with documentation.
 - Enter Number of Labor Hours and the spreadsheet automatically calculates the cost.







- Direct costs hard costs such as printing, permit costs, bicycle helmets, equipment rentals. It may also include services, such as photography and videography.
- Enter Amounts for Direct Costs.
 You must support these costs with documentation.
- After entering your hourly rates, labor hours, and direct costs, the budget spreadsheet automatically calculates the grand total. This number will be your proposed budget.



Eligible Expenses



Expenses should be directly related to the proposed project, including, but not exclusive to:

- Labor costs, such as coordination, design, facilitation, set-up, training, etc.;
- Printing;
- Permits or fees related to the project;
- Bicycle helmets if purchased to support bicycle education;
- Supply or equipment rental fees; and
- Virtual platform subscription fees



Ineligible Expenses



- Ineligible expenses include, but are not limited to:
 - Products or giveaways not tied to a safety educational component (only allowed if they are given away in direct correlation with a safety education component)
 - Stickers (i.e., bumper stickers, stickers for mass distribution at events)
 - Raffle prizes
 - Food or beverages
 - Plants
 - Office furniture purchases
 - Paint
 - Chalk
 - Event entertainment or music
 - Advertising not directly related to proposed project
 - Implementation of a study, plan, or program
 - Habitat conservation plans
 - Lobbying efforts and/or political contributions
 - Items that are not indicated in the original project budget
