# MINUTES OF THE MEETING EXECUTIVE/ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE (EAC) WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 3, 2022

A MOTION was made (McCallon) that the Executive Administration Committee (EAC): (1) make the following findings required by Government Code Section 54953(e)(3) on the basis of the staff report, which is incorporated by this reference, that (i) a proclaimed state of emergency remains active in connection with the COVID-19 public health crisis, (ii) the EAC has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency and (iii) state and local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing in relation to the COVID-19 public health crisis and, further, (2) authorize all legislative bodies of the Southern California Association of Government (SCAG), including the EAC, RC and all committees and task forces established by the RC or SCAG's Bylaws, to utilize remote teleconference meetings pursuant to and in compliance with Brown Act provisions contained in Government Code Section 54953(e). #### **CFO REPORT**

Cindy Giraldo, Chief Financial Officer, highlighted the Audit Committee meeting on July 27, she reported that David James, SCAGs Internal Auditor, presented his findings on a completed procurement internal audit. She stated that while he found SCAG to be generally compliant with its policies and government regulations, he did have a number of recommendations predominantly aimed at approving the efficiency of the process. In addition, to the internal audit report, she suggested review of the Finance Status Report, which was also presented to the Audit Committee. She stated it was an updated status on the progress of the various recommendations included in the report.



# **PRESIDENT'S REPORT**

President Harnik provided an update on the Connect SoCal subcommittee survey that was sent out on July 7th and had closed on July 31st. She informed the members staff was finalizing the lists based off of members preferences and would have a final list by the following week. President Harnik also reported members had spent significant time at the retreat discussing the current schedule for RC and PC meetings. She provided an update on two options that would facilitate more engagement of RC and PC members, with a view towards increasing both participation and the time these bodies could discuss policy issues and provide direction to staff. She informed members that SCAG staff would be sending a survey to RC members asking for their opinion and potential availability with respect to the two options. She also provided an update on the meeting SCAG hosted with State Senator Anthony Portantino on July 20. She informed members that during this meeting, they discussed their Legislative priorities and how they had reiterated their commitment to the Senator's SB 15. Lastly, President Harnik announced that the next meeting of the EAC was scheduled for Wednesday, August 31, 2022 at 3:00 p.m.

#### **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT**

Executive Director Kome Ajise followed up on President Harnik's comments regarding meeting schedules asking members to keep an eye out for the survey. He also reported members would see a draft of the President's Work Plan at the September meeting. He stated they would be looking for member input before they finalized it. Executive Director Ajise also touched on the Other-to-Residential Tool Kit, which he explained was a guide for policy makers on a step-by-step process of converting underutilized non-residential other land to residential uses. He stated this was one of the first deliverables under the REAP 1.0 program. He also reported on his discussion with the Director of HCD. He stated how gratified they were with the passage of SB 197 which provided the relief they were requesting. He stated that though there was relief, there was still work that needed to get done to get cities and counties certified by October 2022, in order to really make use of the relief. Furthermore, Executive Director Ajise, reported that Regional Councilmember Cheryl Viegas-Walker would not be running for re-election in November.

# **FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS**

There were no future agenda items.

#### **ANNOUNCEMENTS**

Regional Council Member Frank Yokoyama, Cerritos, District 23, regarding the survey of the Policy Committees and Regional Council, asked the President if she or the Executive Director had



explained the options that were going to be presented. Executive Director Ajise clarified that the President had gone over that during her comments.

Deborah Robertson, Rialto, District 8, asked the Executive Director for a list of how many housing elements had been cleared, how many did not get adopted. Executive Director Ajise clarified that 21 agencies were compliant and among those there were 3 of the 6 counties and 19 cities. He stated 86 had been adopted and, in the process, and hopefully compliant by October [2022].

Regional Council Member Yokoyama also asked that the housing element status list get emailed to the EAC.

There being no further business, President Harnik adjourned the Special Meeting of the Executive Administration Committee at 3:31 p.m.
