The Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) and California Community Foundation (CCF) are partnering on a new program, the Southern California Call for Collaboration. This program aims to increase community involvement and collaboration in local planning and housing initiatives across the six-county SCAG region by promoting community-driven, equitable growth strategies.

Partnership Programs

Awards to support the expansion and/or implementation of existing plans, initiatives, and/or partnerships that promote equitable growth strategies.



Spark Grants

Smaller, capacity-building grants to seed new models of collaboration and engagement to support community-driven approaches and partnerships that promote equitable growth strategies.

Eligible Activities & Applicants

Eligible activities for this grant program align with the State's REAP program, which requires all activities to result in action-oriented planning policies and programs demonstrating a nexus to increasing and accelerating housing production. Eligible applicants include nonprofit community-based organizations and/ or a partnership with a local government entity (including JPAs and housing authorities). Examples of activities that this program could fund are:

- Education and inclusive community outreach for equitable growth strategies and housing streamlining measures;
- Technical assistance supporting implementation of local planning activities and affordable housing program development;
- **3.** Strategies for neighborhood improvements supporting housing or residential mixed-use development.
